Information about you is important to keep safe.
Here are some ways to do this:



Make sure your passwords are
not easy to guess



Don't tell anyone your password



Don't write down your password



Things you should **keep safe** and not share online:

Age



Date of birth



Bank account details



Your password

CLEAR BROWSING DATA

Clear your **browser history** often



Install and update **antivirus software** on all your internet devices





Don't follow unknown or strange email links, attachments or pop-up windows






Avoid using your personal data when on free Wi-Fi or look for secure sites marked with **https**



Never buy anything online if the website does not begin with **https**

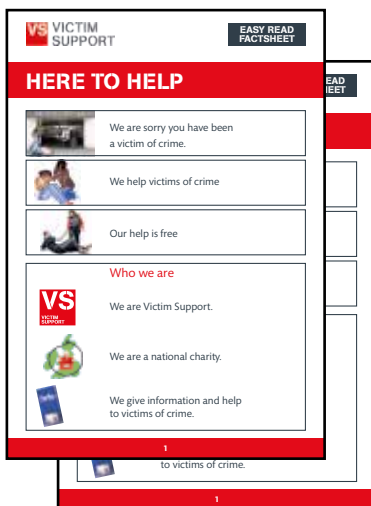
