Home security is when we keep our home safe. This can mean we need to:



Close and lock doors and windows



Close and lock gate and garages





Not have expensive items easily visible from the windows



Don't leave signs that you are not home (such as milk or post on doorstep)



Leave some lights on

Home security is when we keep our home safe. This can mean we need to:



Fit British Standard locks (BS 3621)



Fit a burglar alarm



Fit a smoke and CO (carbon monoxide) alarm



Put a light on a timer or a sensor



Take photos of valuable or much loved items



Mark up important items with a special marker pen



Ask unknown people at the door to show an identity card

We need to think about:



Where we park vehicles



Being insured



Other people having keys (especially rented homes or shared access flats)

Who can you report security concerns to?
